


Figure 2- Signal Technician I Josh Minton repairs a signal box on State St & E. 12<sup>th</sup> Ave (3 Apr)




Figure 4- Operations Hours (July - April)



- City acceptance of Sections 4 & 5 at the Kentucky Trimodal Transpark-On 16 April, the
  - Board of Commissioners approved the acceptance of 1.81 miles of roadway and associated sidewalk and storm sewer. Roadways included are Prosperity Lane and Production Avenue.
- College Street Streetscape Bid Update Scott & Murphy, Inc. will be recommended for award at the 7 May BOC meeting for the sidewalk and streetscape between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- Highland Way & Westen St Roundabout- Property acquisition was completed this month. Construction bid was advertised and the bid opening is scheduled for 15 May. Construction is planned to be completed before schools resume in the fall.
- College Sreet Road Diet Update During the week of 22 April crews began adding new street markings to College Street from Riverview Drive to 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue. All work has been completed.
- FY24 Street Overlay Scotty's Contracting and Stone has completed paving on approximately 5.5 miles of city streets to date.
- West End Greenway Construction Revised bids have been advertised and bid opening is scheduled for 22 May.

# Environmental Compliance Update





- **<u>\$49M Grant Request-</u>** On 16 April the Board of Commissioners approved City Ordinance 2024-67 for the submission of an implementation application to the US Environmental Protection Agency. There are no matching fund requirements for the city. If approved, the city's application included plans for the following:
  - o Electrify GO BG Transit and WKU Transit Fleets- \$25M
  - Expand Green Spaces & Mixed Use Paths- \$9M
  - o Develop & Distribute Solar Generation for WRECC & BGMU- \$16M
- Butler County Landfill Repair- During the week of 15 April a large tear, likely the result of high winds, was discovered in a section of the closed landfill exposed geomembrane synthetic cap (EGSC). The landfill encompasses 266 acres, including 14 acres protected from erosion with the EGSC. The membrane was installed over 10 years ago and the damaged section was 225' by 80' wide. Environmental Manager Matt Powell oversaw the temperary repairs and discussed options with the State Division of Waste Management. An emergency repair order was submitted on 23 April. There is no danger to the public, but there was a chance of significant errosion of the unprotected slope of the landfill in the event of heavy rains.
- Sinkhole Repair Environmetal Compliance Coordinator
   Nick Lawhon advised contractors and oversaw the remediation of a historical sinkhole located just off of Fairview Avenue, near Camden Court. The city budgets annually for sinkhole repairs and remdiation in public access areas, right-of-way and as part of the stormwater infrastructure.






Figure 11- Service Technician Nick Updegraff repairs a hydraulic leak near the Sandra Street Greenway (1 April)






Figure 15-Work Zones (used for sweeping, leaf removal, and snow plowing)
