

Rules of Roundabouts:

What to Know

A **ROUNDABOUT** is a one-way circular intersection without traffic signals or stop signs. They improve traffic flow and safety. Speeds are lowered and conflict points reduced.



Roughly **10,000** roundabouts exist in the United States.



Roundabouts have been around for decades and have been proven to be a safer alternative to traffic signals and stop signs.



To turn **LEFT** or go straight, use the **LEFT** lane.



To turn **RIGHT** or go straight, use the **RIGHT** lane.

SIGNAL as you exit the roundabout.

YIELD to traffic in the roundabout.

Roundabouts **ELIMINATE** right angle crashes and **GREATLY REDUCE** serious crashes.

90% reduction in all fatal crashes*

37% reduction in all crashes*

75% reduction in injury crashes*

40% reduction in pedestrian injuries*

Key Steps:



Slow down.



Yield to cars in the roundabout.



Stay in correct lane.



Do not stop within a roundabout.
