



Figure 3- Operations Hours (July-December)

Plats Reviewed Subdivision Inspections ROW Permits



- Ken Bale Blvd @ Drakes Restaurant. The Planning and Design team procured a new curb system for installation near the new Drakes Restaurant in the amount of \$5,800.
- Scottsville Road Multi-Use Path: A progress meeting was held and preliminary designs reviewed with our design team including MPO and KYTC representatives.
- **Riverview Avenue Pedestrian Islands:** (grant funded) Bid document reviewed with KYTC Central Office representatives.
- Cave Mill Road Widening: Correspondence sent to the most significantly impacted residents. A public meeting is scheduled for late January.
- Three Springs Road Sidewalk Extension: In late October 2024, a TAP Grant application was approved for funding for a 5' sidewalk extension. The sidewalk will begin at Wheatstone Avenue and terminate approximately 500' past Fieldstone Blvd. In-house topographic survey was completed in December. Design has begun.




Figure 7-The Board of Commissioners approved the 2025 Street Overlay on 3 December. The areas depicted in red will be milled and replaced with new asphalt, markings and ADA ramps. In total, up to 11 miles of roadway will be replaced/repaired. Areas are also deconflicted with planned improvements from the local utilities. Funding is provided from the Kentucky Liquid Fuel Tax and \$1 Million dollars from the General Fund.



### Environmental Compliance Update

**Erosion Prevention and Sediment Control (EPSC) class:** On 5 December, Matt Wisenden instructed 18 contractors on Best Management Practices and city requirements for EPSC at construction sites. Wisenden and Howell worked with NCS and the PIO to record and create transcripts of the course for translation and on 27 December presented the course for two Vietnamese speaking contractors. This class is held multiple times per year and is augmented with field day events, such as last month's Muddy Water Blues.

**Big Bertha Cave Inspection**: On 13 December, members of the Environmental Compliance Division, PW Director and members of the Bowling Green Fire Department entered Big Bertha Cave. The cave is part of the Lost River Cave system. The purpose of the inspection was to conduct water sampling, familiarize first

responders with cave topography and to obtain pictures and videos for karst educational purposes. The team wore reflective gear, had multiple sources of light and air quality sensors. Cave entry is a dangerous activity and should only be accomplished by trained professionals.

**Geologist Update**: BGPW staff are currently familiarizing themselves with the electrical resistivity equipment purchased this fall and the software that accompanies it. We have researched the various application methods and used the software to build appropriate programs for 14, 28, and 56 pin surveys. One test survey has been conducted, with five scheduled for the first half of January 2025. In layman's terms, the equipment allows a skilled technician to "view" voids and subterranean features returned to a laptop screen when electrical currents are run through the ground.




Figure 8-Water sampling and injection well monitoring in Big Bertha Cave (13 December)

<u>GIS Capability Increase</u>: On 30 December the staff took delivery of an Arrow 200 Dual-Frequency, Multi-Constellation GNSS Receiver. The device will allow staff to collect spatial data regarding storm sewer features and update the City's GIS information without third party vendors or requiring direct support from



other City departments. This will expedite the City's decade's long project to map our storm sewer systems.




- Month Summary

  - On 4 December, Fleet procured scene lighting for Unit 2240 (2010 Pierce Arrow Aerial Truck) ) in the amount of \$6,570






*Figure 9-Rust!* This is one of the snow plow trucks and suffers from rapid salt corrosion. The brake and fuel lines, fuel tank and battery compartment required replacement by the Fleet Division (27 December)
